

VISA ON ARRIVAL

1. The Indonesian Minister of Law and Human Rights of the Republic of Indonesia has issued and signed a new decree no.M.02-IZ.01.10 dated May 28, 2007, stating that citizen from the following 62 (countries) and 1 (one) territory can apply for their Visitor's Visa upon arrival at certain Airports/Seaports in Indonesia for a maximum visit of 30 (thirty) days.

3. Visas on Arrival will be granted for citizens of the above-mentioned countries who wish to make a visit for the purpose of tourism (holiday), social and cultural visits and official government business. Visas on Arrival are issued for a maximum period of 30 days and cannot be extended.

4. The fee for a Visa on Arrival is US\$ 25 for stay up to 30 (thirty) days or US\$ 10 for up to 7 (seven) days.
5. A visa on arrival can be obtained at the following designated ports of entry into Indonesia:
